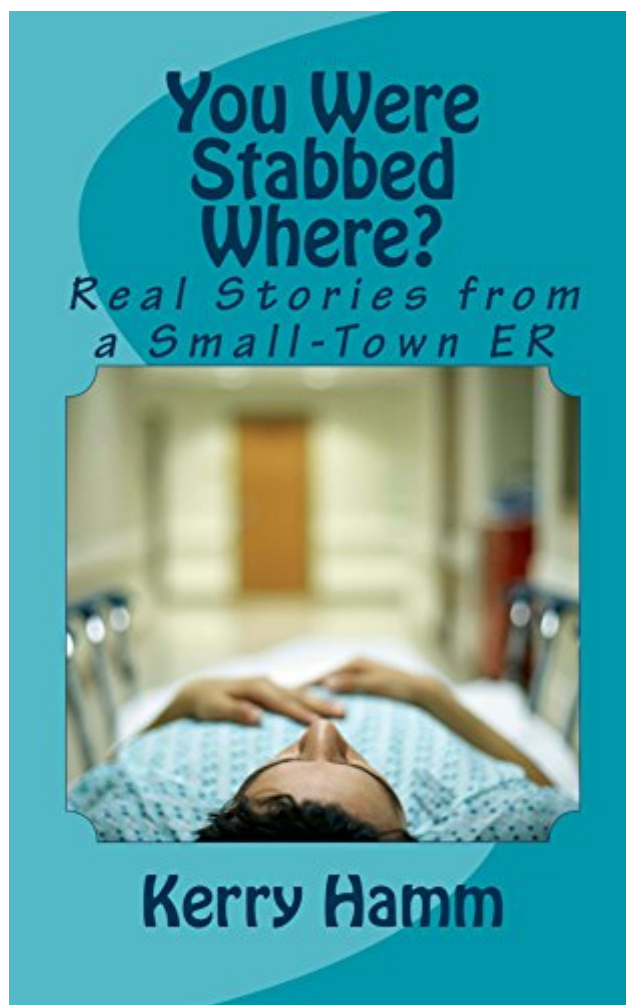


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You Were Stabbed Where?: Real Stories From A Small-Town ER

I collapsed in his arms, and he poured me into a wheelchair. The next thing I knew, they were trying to get me out of the wheelchair for a CT scan, but I could not get up. I ended up in the ICU for 5 weeks. The last thing in this book says about people waiting until 3am to come in but does not really explain why that's not a good idea. I kind of get the picture that the ER could get crazy at any time. But I would still like to hear a fuller explanation of why my reasoning was faulty. Is it just because I didn't know any better? Or is it something common sense that I am missing? Anyway, I'm working my way through all of these. I'm drinking them in like a sponge. I spent 9-1/2 months in the hospital, so there is a lot here that is familiar. I learned, in the hospital, the secret about nurses. They are here to save my @\$\$, not kiss it. As long as you keep that in mind, you will get along fine :) with them. I love nurses, they taught me so much good stuff, I am so grateful. I'm getting a lot of good info from these books as well. These are really good to read, I hope more people come across them. I know I will be recommending them to my Kindle friends.
