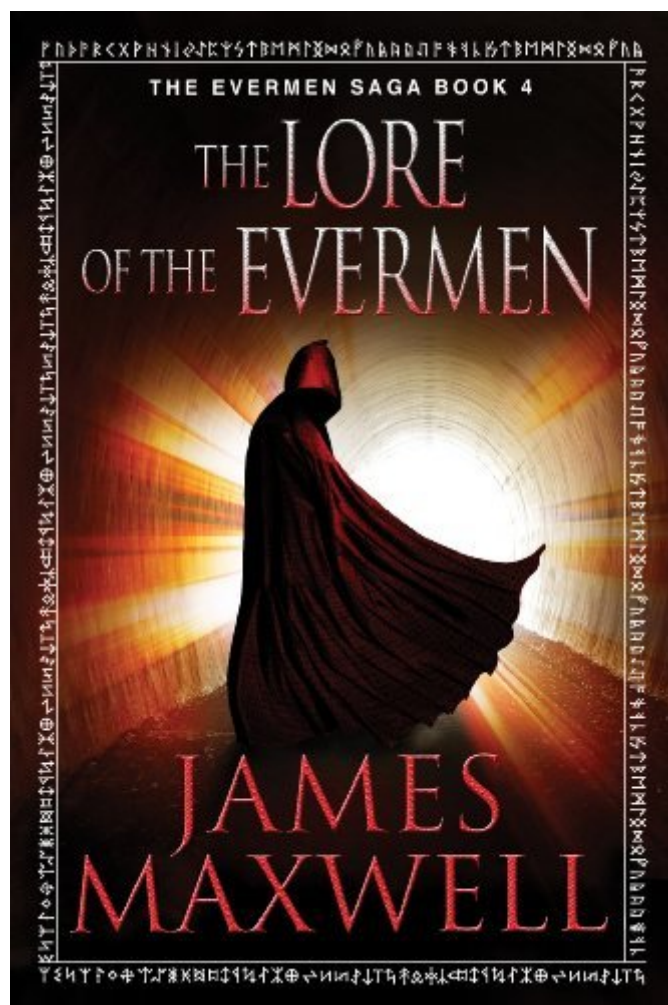


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The Lore Of The Evermen (The Evermen Saga Book 4)

I am sad to say this is my least favorite in the Evermen Saga. There wasn't any surprises to how the story paid off. It felt like the obvious path was taken most often. Still I don't want to give the impression that I didn't like it. It is a competent ending to the series. I just felt it was okay instead of a slam dunk. The hardest part of the book was the middle. At this portion the book has many huge battles. The story really isn't progressing at this point. It is just battle description. The good guys are

only defending. I just didn't feel very interested in hearing about defense. I want to have a plan going. I needed some mystery to keep me turning the page. There is still a lot to love about this conclusion. The way the author wraps up the story in the end is very satisfying. I found the closing chapters some of the best in the series. Also any chapter that has Ella or Miro as the narrator is great. They are very good characters that I have grown quite fond of. I don't know if James Maxwell plans to write anymore books in the Evermen saga. This series on a whole is very good. Whatever he writes I will read.
